### Charges for Inspection of Ships

The Association of Port Health Authorities (Environmental Health and Hygiene Committee) agreed at its meeting of 6<sup>th</sup> December 2007 to recommend to its members a standard charging regime for the issue of Ship Sanitation Exemption and Ship Sanitation Control Certificates. The charges were reviewed on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2009 and again on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2010 and it was agreed that charges would be held constant through to December 2010.

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### SHIP INSPECTION CHARGES- as of 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010

Gross Tonnage	Charge (£)
Up to 3,000	100
3,001-10,000	150
10,001-20,000	200
20,001-30,000	230
Over 30,000	300

With the exception of:

- Vessels with the capacity to carry between 50 and 1000 persons- **£300**
- Vessels with the capacity to carry more than 1000 persons- **£500**

Extra charges may be added for exceptional costs such as launch hire, lengthy journeys to the port or laboratories, out of hours visits and samples taken.

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*Note* - the Department of Health no longer sets the charges for ship inspection in the UK. The Association hopes that all UK ports will adopt these charges and in doing so consistency in the UK will be promoted. APHA is of the opinion that these charges are exempt from VAT.
